Daniel Villegas of Juan Neustadtel, Jarvis' Colombian representative, visited Jarvis' Middletown facility on October 23, 2000. Mr. Vincent R. Volpe, President of Jarvis Products Corporation, provided a personal tour of the headquarters and manufacturing facility. Discussed during the visit were current conditions affecting the

Colombian meat industry, and new ideas for improving Jarvis equipment sales in Colombia. Mr. Villegas is in charge of Juan Neustadtel's sales operation. He is responsible for all sales in Colombia, with the exception of the Bogota area, which is handled by David Montoya, the company's other sales manager.

"The Colombian meat and poultry industries are just starting to grow. The meat packing plants in my country are becoming fully automated. Plant owners are looking for additional, cost-effective equipment to augment production. There is a serious financial situation affecting the poultry industry - the price of product versus the current price of feed. The poultry industry is currently looking for products to cut costs and increase productivity. This is a good time for Jarvis and my company to develop a sound sales plan and marketing strategy" - Daniel Villegas.

John Neustadtel, an Austrian immigrant, founded Juan Neustadtel in the 1950's to import paper products. Today the company is an importer and distributor of products that support Colombia's extensive meatpacking and poultry processing industries. John Neustadtel died in 1975. President Walter Weber, and Vice President Jose Luis Peralta currently run the twenty employee company which maintains offices in both Medellin and Bogota.

Juan Neustadtel and Jarvis Products have a ten-year relationship. Products mainly imported for the meat industry are Jarvis SEC circular breaking saws, JCIII A dehiders, carcass splitting band saws, Model 500HC and Model 30CL-1/CL-2 hock cutters. For poultry processors, Model VC poultry vent cutters, LKE-1 lung guns and Model CPE chicken hock and neck cutters are the chief imports. "In Colombia Jarvis is a well known and highly respected company having a good image associated with a quality product", says Mr. Villegas. He was greatly impressed with the advanced technologies observed at our Middletown production facility. According to Daniel Villegas, "Jarvis has a technological advantage which works against its competitors".
